Speaking of Speaking Norwegian

There is a blog post on the International website about dialects in Norway. There are two official written languages, but no official spoken one in Norway. "As far as regional dialects, there are four main groupings of spoken Norwegian: Northern (nordnorsk), Central (trøndersk), Western (vestlandsk) and Eastern (østnorsk). Each area has its own *talemål* or dialect that differs from the written standards and no speech variant is considered better than the other." There are even dialects within dialects – for example, Western Norwegian (vestlandsk) has Western and Southern branches and there are divisions in these, such as the Valle-Setesdalsk dialect in Upper Setesdal and Valle.

Language Camps are back!!

2023 Registration for District 2 Youth Camps begins Feb 14. The camps are:
Camp Trollhaugen - (ages 13-15) Easton, WA June 25 - July 8, 2023
Camp Nidaros – (ages 9-12) Gearhart, OR July 9 - 22, 2023
Camp Normanna- (ages 9-12) Lake Riley, WA July 23 – August 5, 2023

Total all-inclusive tuition for each two-week camp is \$700. will be recorded in the order in which they are received. To attend camp, children must have a parent, grandparent or sponsor who is a Sons of Norway member in District 2.

There are two District-wide scholarships available to campers. The Draxten Memorial Fund awards funds to D2 campers who are also receiving funds from their local lodge. The amount varies from year to year, based on the total number of awards handed out. The Sofie/Olson Memorial Scholarship Fund supplies money to the children and grandchildren of district members to attend D2 youth camps.
