## Things to do in Scandinavia in October:

### The Baltic Herring Market in Helsinki Finland

The Baltic Herring Market in Helsinki, Finland, is a popular weeklong seafood festival. The Baltic Herring Market is a fish fair that has been taking place annually in early October since 1743.

During the Baltic Herring Market, fishermen provide their best Baltic herring cooked in different ways, with different tastes. You also find crafts and wool clothing, and witness the Herring Market jury selecting the year's best-marinated fish and herring surprise.

The Baltic Herring Market is hosted by the city of Helsinki and takes place prominently on the Market Square in the center of Helsinki.

### The Iceland Airwaves Festival in Reykjavik, Iceland

This is probably Scandinavia's largest music festival in October. The Iceland Airwaves Festival is a major annual event, taking place in Iceland's capital Reykjavik.

For several years now, this Icelandic event has been growing into a huge festival. The Iceland Airwaves Festival always takes place in downtown Reykjavik, each year during the third week of October.

There are two types of locations: main venues and "off-venue" locations. The 8 main venues (clubs and bars) are easy to find, in downtown Reykjavik - especially if you're familiar with the nightlife in Reykjavik.

Off-venue performances are parties, DJ & band gigs, etc., are held in music stores and smaller bars. All in all, the Iceland Airwaves Festival offers music-lovers over 170 national and international stars and starlets.

Make sure not to miss a big part of the Iceland Airwaves Festival - the official Saturday night party in the Blue Lagoon!

Tickets for the festival are available on the Iceland Airwaves Website. Watch out for special festival offers for travelers from the local airline Icelandair. Hotel rooms may be harder to come by during the festival, so take a look at great Reykjavik hotels and book early.

### BergArt: The Bergen Art Festival in Bergen, Norway

The Bergen Art Festival (short "BergArt") is a large annual fall event in the Norwegian town of Bergen.

Each year in mid-October, BergArt offers visitors lots of contemporary art and entertainment and the program includes live music of several genres, film showings, and different dance and theater performances.

The Bergen Art Festival in Norway consists of several parts: the music festival with great concerts, a literature festival for authors and publishers, and FLAZZ, a jazz-themed festival with star performers. Then, there is also BIFF (short for Bergen International Film Festival) in which visitors can watch films from all over the world.

### Halloween in Tivoli, Copenhagen!

Halloween in Tivoli Gardens is Copenhagen's famous Halloween event which you simply have to see. The Tivoli in Copenhagen will stay open during the Danish annual fall break (autumn holidays) in the middle of October and you should definitely take your family to join the festivities for a fun scare.

Each mid-October, Tivoli is transformed into an enchanted Halloween-universe. Pumpkins, smiling scarecrows, funny witches and Tivolis own 'heroes' help to create a funny scare for children of all ages.

During Halloween in Tivoli in Copenhagen, ALL rides will be open. Inside the Main Entrance the Tivoli is setting up a Harvest Fair containing all manners of exciting things to do with the autumn season. Around the Mill, a village was built, containing many fun activities for the children. They will be able to make pumpkin heads, brew magic potions, catch spiders and buy assorted Halloween trinkets.
