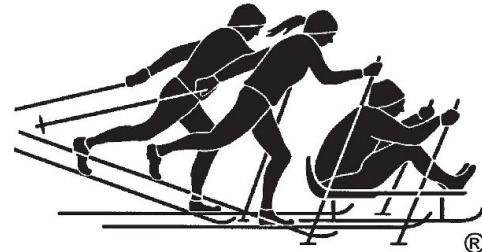
october 21st meeting
